Topic 2 : Social work, a political issue?

The context of the round table

We can indeed observe that the training models and the social work definition are very different depending on the country. We can also observe that there is a real distance between the political decision makers and the actors on the field. European civil society is trying to emerge and play a leading role but to this day there is still little convergence of struggles and actions to try to find i solutions, to promote access to rights and to social policies building different than corrective policies imposed by the institutions. Social intervention must not be an agent of social peace of a society that excludes some of its members by undertaking social integration projects and by favouring the curative solution. We think it necessary that it also deals with the social transformation dimension and the reversal of the power relationships. It is therefore in this perspective that we must question the social workers' training and action.
