The context of the round table

Today we find that individualized pathways and people's responsibility with regards to their situations become the norm in the intervention and social action. However, it seems to us that the collective dimension is a lever to promote social transformation so that the most vulnerable communities are no longer considered as the receptacles of public policies and of sums of difficulties that must be corrected but that they must be considered as real players. How can we reintroduce the idea that all citizens are subjects in law and that they are not the system "assisted" people?
